#### **Outreach Update**

## <u>Trinity's Partnership with Rappahannock County Elementary School (RCES)</u> kicks off the new school year!

Please help support our County's students by contributing to a special collection for RCES at church on Rally Day, September 9<sup>th</sup>! Last year Trinity provided \$1,468 (a 50/50 match of individual contributions and an Outreach Grant) to support a discretionary fund at RCES. The Guidance Counselor used the fund to support participation in school activities by students in need of financial assistance. Activities supported included participation in field trips and the annual Book Fair. Our 2018 partnership goal is \$2,000. Can't attend Rally Day? #### Haiti Update

Our ministries in Haiti continue to evolve. Check Trinity's FaceBook page for the latest news. New happenings included:

- After five years, our partner priest, Goursse Celestine, has been reassigned to Saint Benoit Parrish, and Deacon Jean Junior will be our partner for the St. Marc School in Trouin. We expect Trade School Classes will begin a new term in September.
- Our partner Voix et Actions is testing a pilot program to support economic and social justice for several women. Goods such as rice, pasta and cooking oil are purchased in Port Au Prince and "loaned" to the women who then resell them for a profit in Trouin. Voix et Actions is able to transport the goods to Trouin at minimal additional cost in conjunction with operation of the Village Farm. This savings in transportation will significantly increase the profit for each of the women. If successful, this program could provide the women a steady income to supplement the periodic income of animals sold from the Village Farm.
- Your Outreach Committee has commissioned production of a 5 minute video to help tell the story of Voix et Actions and our efforts to create sustainable economic growth through the Trouin Village Farm. The video should be available later this year.
- Rev. Jenks Hobson is planning a visit to St. Marc and Trouin in November, please contact him or Russ Collins if interested.
