#### Outreach: Moving Toward Sustainable Ministry in Haiti

Three programs in 2019 will help us move just a bit closer to our ideal of helping our Haitian friends become better able to help themselves.

An Agricultural Consultant, Renee Anderson, will spend several months working with the Village Farm in Trouin to suggest ways to improve production and reduce costs. She is a recent graduate of Mississippi State Agricultural School with a specialty in animal husbandry. Renee visited Haiti and the Village Farm last year and has volunteered her time to help. Trinity Outreach is assisting with Renee's expenses.

<u>The Solar System at St Marc School</u> will be expanded to provide electrical power to the Village Farm and local community. St. James Episcopal Church in Leesburg, VA has provided funds for this effort. The expansion will provide St. Marc with a source of income and electrical power for the Village Farm.

<u>Solar Technician Training</u> will be conducted at St. Marc as part of a Solar Partnership with DigitalKap. The Partnership will establish a "Solar Academy" with classes at three sites that will train Haitians to meet the need for skilled solar technicians. We are part of a broad Solar Academy coalition that includes:
